STANDING UP TO FALLS

Every year, about three million older adults are treated in an emergency department for a fall injury. Many end up with broken bones and dangerous head injuries. Yet many of these falls can be prevented.

Protect yourself from falls with these helpful tips from the National Institute on Aging:

* Talk with your health care provider about

medication side effects.

- * Make your home safer by using night lights, installing grab bars in the bathroom, and securing carpet to the floors.
- * Stand up slowly to avoid dizziness.
- * Do strength and balance exercises.
- * Get your vision and hearing checked regularly.
- * Use a cane or walker if you need more stability.






